The board of control of the canal constituted by the Legislature, consisting of the Governor, Auditor United States vs. State of Michigan, 190 U. S., 379. General and State Treasurer, was, however, authorized to establish other rates of toll after giving thirty days notice in two daily papers published in Detroit and Cleveland, and to make rules for the regulation of the canal, which should be binding on the superintendent, who was subject to removal for cause, and in case of vacancy the office of Superintendent could be filled for the remainder of the term by the Board.
